TRACCskills Pilot Workshop 1

Higher Education

Lüneburg, Germany, 6-8 December 2022

+ online follow-up sessions, 10 & 24 January 2023

Summary report

The initial workshop must by any criteria be deemed a success. The ongoing and final assessments of participants were overwhelmingly positive, and the project team met their own objectives for the event, within budget. The support of Leuphana University was much appreciated.

The follow-up online sessions showed high interest in implementing the lessons learned in the participants' working life. Some stumbling blocks were revealed and discussed. The generally positive outcome was documented via the responses to the post-event questionnaire.

New connections were made that continue into 2023 and hopefully beyond; several prospects and concepts for collaboration are being discussed as the project closes.



Initial workshop

A final exercise using the Nominal Group Technique (NGT) method focused on evaluation of every aspect of the workshop. It elicited more than 100 comments and suggestions, a large majority of which were positive. Two examples:

"Great set of exercises and flow, overall enough time to test and taste."

"Great tools and time to experience them."

Suggestions included improvements to instructions, and a reiterated wish for a slightly longer workshop - perhaps 2.5 days instead of 2. A separate collation of the feedback is available on request.

At the second session participants presented and discussed their experiences with introducing the new methods into their work.


Post-Workshop Survey



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
